School Mass: That we are active members of our Catholic church was evidenced in the special celebration of our annual school mass with Fr. John Kearns. The children participated wholeheartedly and reverently in readings and prayers. Our €100 collection for Trócaire, offered at this mass was sent to the charity group and they recently sent us a letter expressing their gratitude to the children.

Attendance: My thanks to parents for continuing to send in notes and letting teachers know reasons for your child's absences from school. Please retain all documentation regarding children being absent from school for 20 days or more, particularly documentation for those children who missed a lot of time last term due to illness. This will be required when a child is referred to the Education Welfare Officer under the terms of the Education Welfare Act 2000.

Music/French Classes: We hope to resume tin whistle lessons with Mr. Fran McMahon and French classes with Mrs. Janette McPhillips this term. A total of €240 raised through the Christmas raffle will help to furnish payment of these classes. Other amounts collected through the recycling collection will also be added to this fund.

Healthy Eating Initiative: In October Emma McBride, on behalf of An Bord Bia, introduced us to the 'Food Dudes Programme'. Having explored and tasted a variety of healthy fruit and vegetables delivered to the school, the second phase now encourages children to continue bringing in these foods from home, thereby earning new prizes. I consider this a valuable and worthwhile initiative and thank you for your support in ensuring that children continue with their healthy snacks and lunches.

Altar Servers: We recognise and applaud those pupils who are committed to altar serving in St. Alphonsus' Church. A new rota has been distributed to pupils for the coming term. Once again please make appropriate arrangements should your child be unable to serve at an assigned mass. Sincere thanks to the Parents' Association for your generous donation of €2,150 towards the purchase of the interactive whiteboards. We look forward to using these boards to reinforce work being undertaken in the classroom.

Trips: On Thursday, 2nd October the senior classes enjoyed an informative book writing session with author Oisín McGann and also participated in a quiz in the library for *Children's Book Festival*. On Thursday 4th December the junior classes were highly entertained at a pantomime, 'Rudolph and The Red Nosed Reindeer', in Cavan Town Hall. Then we all savoured the musical experience, 'Stars in Their Eyes' in Largy College the following week.

As part of the Science curriculum, the senior classes will, once again, participate in the 'Discover Primary Science' programme. Various scientific activities and science trips will be central to this initiative. The aim, ultimately, is to lead pupils to explore, devise and develop their own experiments and investigations.

Charity: The most vivid memories in St. Comgall's of Christmases past involve our participation in the 'Christmas Shoebox Appeal'. It marks a great opportunity for children to experience that Christmas is not just about gifts received, but rather is a special time for giving to less fortunate children. Sincere thanks for your wholehearted support with this initiative - a total of thirty shoeboxes were filled.
