Earlier that day, as part of the History Curriculum, the senior pupils explored aspects of World War I with Pauline Tilson of the Monaghan Museum. Using a slide presentation and wonderful, old photographs, Pauline showed us food that was eaten during war times and talked about daily occurrences that were a reality for people at that time. The impact of 'Trench Warfare' was discussed and we examined food parcels that present day soldiers use while on foreign duty... most interesting!

**During the month of March** we participated in the 'Publish-a-Poem Competition', organised by the Monaghan Education Centre. We consider it another effective tool to help develop pupil's writing abilities and their imaginative and critical abilities. The 'Value of Homework' was a theme on which we were reflecting in the senior classroom, so the resulting poems make for an enjoyable read. We are participating in the Green Schools programme, an initiative which aims to foster environmental awareness in our school and the wider community. We are working towards our third flag which is focused on water. As part of the process, on Wednesday, 22<sup>nd</sup> March, we underwent an assessment on our knowledge of water with Niall O'Connor of Monaghan County Council and I am delighted to say that we were successful. He gave us permission to submit our official application and informed us that the presentation of the third flag will take place in *The City North Hotel* at some date in May. Two/three pupils will represent us at that event with Mrs. Pennell and then we will celebrate the raising of the flag here at the school, sometime in June.





The "Something Fishy' workshop held in the school on the 23<sup>rd</sup> March was an educational programme aimed at promoting more awareness in our understanding of fish, water, and angling. After a very informative talk and a slide presentation, we were allowed to view and touch fish such as perch, roach, young salmon and eel in their fish tanks. Examining water bugs under the microscope was also encouraged and finally we were able to appreciate the size of pike and brown trout as frozen samples on display. All in all, a fish-tabulous experience!

'Internet Safety Workshops for both senior pupils and parents with Eimear Murphy of REIM Training Solutions were held in the school on Wednesday, 29<sup>th</sup> March. The school workshop proved to be most beneficial in promoting a safer internet for our young users.
